ABOUT THE SEASON: A NOTE FROM ARTISTIC DIRECTOR

I inherited an antique cedar chest from my great aunt filled with items from the Great Depression — ordinary towels, pillow cases, blankets embroidered to create something precious in a time of scarcity. I could almost see the way the deep want of those years stitched itself onto her being.

As we have moved through all the extraordinary events of this past year I have often thought about the ways humans are marked by events, people, experiences. In moments of collective tragedy we may feel that etching more because we recognize the shaping happening in us by seeing it happen to the world around us. But every individual is constantly re-formed by the wounds and gifts of time and place, opportunity and culture.

In this season of Scars and Emblems, we open the door to those shape-shifting stories, welcoming artists to reflect on the common and uncommon ways they have been marked.

We are deeply honored that the incomparable Ursula Rucker — visionary, activist, Philadelphia legend and extraordinary artist — agreed to curate this season's *Close Ups* series. She brought her wisdom and artistic prowess to assembling and mentoring an exceptional group of artists to delve into their scars and emblems. Her unique voice infuses the series with a depth of exploration and a freedom of expression that feels revelatory.

And our first live performance in over 2 years, planned for spring 2022, couldn't be more timely. Ruth Naomi Floyd's prescient work *The Frances Suite* is an urgent, joyful, searing musical jewel that traverses the prophetic life of a largely unsung poetic voice from history to find markers for a just and vibrant future.

Thank you for stepping onto this new path with us. I hope you will find something in this season of stories that moves you deeply and perhaps leaves an indelible impression.

ABOUT THE CURATOR:



Poet, recording artist, songwriter, activist and revolutionary Ma'at Mama, Ursula Rucker is a certified veteran of the global music and poetry scene. A skilled writer and dynamic performer, Rucker's rich and textured voice is one of the world's great, living instruments. Born and raised in Philadelphia, Rucker has released five wide-ranging albums and built an equally impressive catalogue as a collaborator, working with everyone from The Roots to DJ King Britt side-project Firefly, 4Hero, Jazzanova, Louie Vega and Doodlbug of Digable Planets.

Today, Rucker enjoys an influential standing as a respected poet and vocalist. Philadelphia's Mural Arts Program features two portraits of Rucker — the 2013 building-sized commission by artist Jetsonorama titled "You Go Girl", and a new mural in Rucker's home neighborhood of Germantown unveiled in August 2021. Recent accomplishments include being a 2018 recipient of the prestigious fellowship award from The Pew Center for Arts & Change, and a 2020 sold-out release of *big/small poems for pockets*, a chapbook of haikus.


